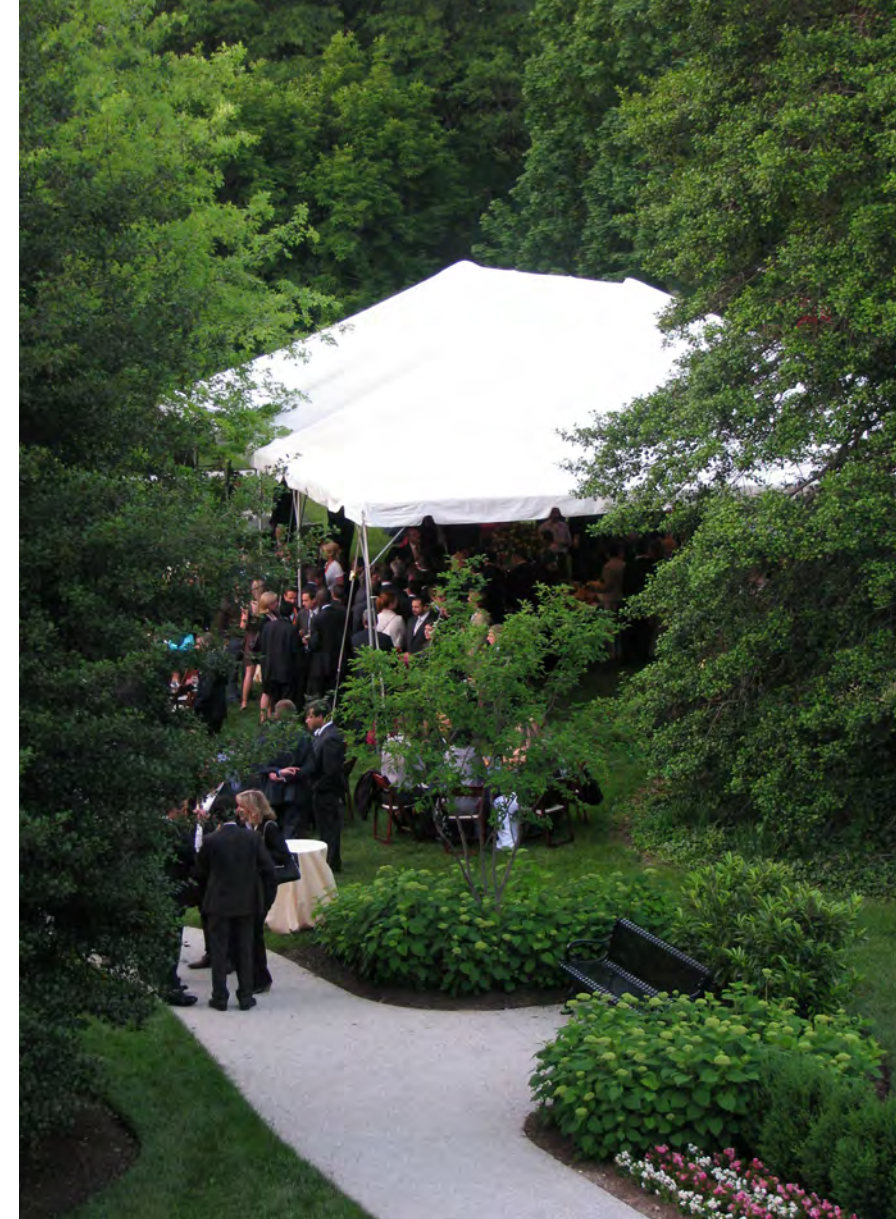
Located on a picturesque hilltop in Northwest Washington, D.C., President Lincoln's Cottage opened to the public in 2008. The Lincoln family lived here for over a quarter of his presidency, from June-November of 1862, 1863, and 1864. It was during his time at the Cottage that Lincoln worked on the Emancipation Proclamation and made many critical decisions about the course of the Civil War. The Lincolns also used this retreat as a social venue, entertaining politicians, friends and even unexpected visitors. Today, this National Monument offers many options for unique and memorable events of all kinds.





The lushly landscaped grounds and historic buildings provide a charming backdrop for outdoor events and activities. A tent may be erected on the lawn adjacent to the Visitor Education Center. We also offer:

- ~ discounts for non-profit and government groups

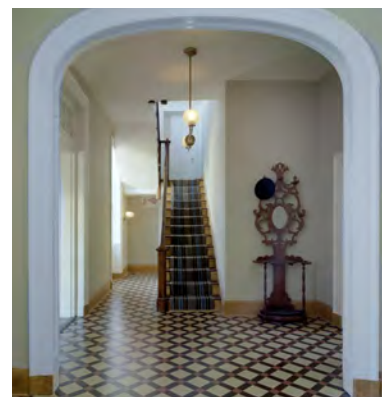
